

**Report of CMA Men's Ministry: National Coordinators and National Leadership
Team Meetings
January 30-21, 2004**

Six National Coordinators met with the CMA Men's Ministry National Director, Jim Peterson in Atlanta, GA, on January 30, 2004. The National coordinators represent training, resources, inventory, communications, national projects, and finance. The coordinators reported on progress in their areas, refined area responsibilities, and further defined area direction and strategies. It was agreed that the National Coordinators serve as the staff supporting the National Leadership Team (district CMA Men's Ministry coordinators).

Eleven District Coordinators and Jim Peterson met as the National Leadership Team in Atlanta, GA, January 30-31. The leadership team received reports from and provided suggestions to each National Coordinator.

During the two days the following actions were agreed upon:

- Undertake a National Project involving financial support for the annual New **Official Workers Pastors' Orientation**, beginning in 2005 (**mission field location**). A task force was appointed to develop strategies for engaging CMA men and soliciting funds. The intent is to announce this project at the CMA Men's luncheon at General Council (Saturday, June 5) in Sacramento.
- Formulated a plan for the CMA Men's booth at General Council in June.
- Received a report that, after known expenses have been paid, we will have about \$3000 in the bank.
- Approved a plan to sell CMA Men logo golf shirts with \$5.00 of the proceeds going to fund the National Men's operating expenses. Shirts may be ordered at <http://www.nwdcma.org/alliance.htm>
- Set the fiscal as July through June.
- Began establishing uniform reporting from district coordinators related to CMA Men goals and objectives.
- Appointed a task force to begin drafting a National Constitution and District and local church CMA Men bylaws.

The National Coordinators will meet August 6-7, 2004 in Chicago.
